VENICE

Guests arrive at Venice airport and are greeted with a dedicated vehicle at the plane, including fast track and porter service. A private Mercedes vehicle transfers them to the dock, where a private motorboat awaits to take them to their accommodation in the city.

Gorgeous palaces, quaint squares, mosaics, glittering masks gazing from shop windows, gondolas and fiery-red sunsets over the lagoon. Unique, mysterious and intriguing, Venice is one of the most amazing cities in the world. Explore the heart of Venice and breathe in the one-of-a-kind atmosphere! Visit the city's major landmarks and admire the main sights on shore and from the canal with the privilege of private specialized guide assistance and private motorboat transportation.

Walk along the canals lined by gorgeous palaces to iconic St Mark's Square, crowned by the grandiose St Mark's Basilica. Founded in the 9th century to house the remnants of St Mark it burned down in 976 and was then rebuilt as we see it today: polychrome domes, walls clad in marbles and over 8000 square meters of luminous mosaics. Highlights include the glittering ceiling mosaics, many made with 24-carat gold leaf, the basilica's oldest mosaics and the three golden domes.

Board your private motorboat and set off on a memorable 1-hour cruise along

Venice's fabled shimmering canals lined by gorgeous ancient palaces. Sail across the Grand Canal enjoying your guide's anecdotes about the haughty noble families who once populated the vast palaces' halls, discover the minor side-canals enhanced by quaint charming bridges. Memorable palaces, bewitching atmospheres and glimpses of eternity... experience Venice's enchanted aura!

day 2 VENICE

In Venice, immerse yourself in the city's world-renowned modern and contemporary art scene. Begin with a visit to the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, a must-see for art enthusiasts, showcasing an exceptional selection of modern works by iconic artists such as Jackson Pollock, Pablo Picasso, and Salvador Dalí. Located in Peggy Guggenheim's former home along the Grand Canal, the museum offers a deeper understanding of 20th-century art movements, paired with stunning views of Venice's waterways.

Next, continue your artistic journey with a visit to Palazzo Grassi and Punta della Dogana. Both venues are part of the prestigious François Pinault Collection and feature contemporary international art. The exhibitions rotate regularly, allowing visitors to explore cutting-edge works in two remarkable architectural settings. Palazzo Grassi's 18th-century façade contrasts elegantly with the avant-garde installations inside, while Punta della Dogana, housed in a former customs building, provides an extraordinary backdrop for contemporary artworks.

Throughout the day, you will also have the opportunity to take in some of Venice's most iconic sights. As you travel between museums, you may catch glimpses of the Rialto Bridge, the bustling Piazza San Marco, and the majestic St. Mark's Basilica. 

DAY 3 MILAN

Transfer from Venice to Milan.

Vibrant, avant-garde and glamorous. Among the innumerable attractions sophisticated Milan offers one just cannot miss visiting the city's most famous and iconic landmark, the Duomo, and most sensational masterpiece, Leonardo's Last Supper. Step off the beaten tourist path, see the sights led by a specialized private guide and enjoy an added twist: privileged access to the Duomo terraces, for a marble-framed rooftop stroll! Start your day viewing Leonardo Da Vinci's stupefying Last Supper, one of the most famous artworks in the world. Depicting the scene in which Jesus declares that one of the Apostles will betray him the painting boasts an innovative approach: the portrayal of the disciples shows the person's reactions, making the painting a profound study of a variety of diverse human emotions. Enjoy a memorable guided visit to Milan's most glorious sight, the flamboyant Duomo, a mammoth building elaborately decorated with countless spires, pinnacles, buttresses and statues. Enter easily with skip-the-line access, follow your guide down the naves framed by dark stone pillars learning all about its history. Admire the black, pink, and white marble floor and splendid stained-glass windows and crown your day with an unforgettable skywalk and close up meeting with spires and pinnacles, statues and gargoyles. Enjoy hassle-free priority access to the elevators up the steepest portion of the church and walk up the last 50 steps to the rooftop terrace. Admire sweeping views of the bustling city as you walk surrounded by a forest of delicately forged marble pinnacles. Learn about the secrets which lie behind the beautiful statues and marvel at how mesmerizing the carvings and flying buttresses appear from so close up.

day 4 MILAN

Immerse yourself in the city's rich blend of art and innovation. Visit the Museo del Novecento, a dynamic museum that celebrates 20th-century Italian art. The museum is located right in Piazza del Duomo, offering not only remarkable artworks but also panoramic views of Milan's iconic cathedral, the Duomo di Milano. This architectural masterpiece, with its intricate Gothic spires, is one of the most recognized landmarks in Italy. In the afternoon, continue your artistic journey at the renowned Fondazione Prada, a cutting-edge institution dedicated to contemporary art and culture. The Fondazione Prada is known for its innovative exhibitions, which blend art with philosophy, literature, and film. A DAY TO TURIN

ROME
