DAY 1

VENICE

Guests arrive at Venice airport and are greeted with a dedicated vehicle at the plane, including fast track and porter service. A private Mercedes vehicle transfers them to the dock, where a private motorboat awaits to take them to their accommodation in the city.

Upon arriving in Venice, you will immediately feel immersed in the city's unique atmosphere. A private guide will meet you and lead you on an enchanting journey through this floating city. The tour will begin at Piazza San Marco, Venice's iconic square, where you will be introduced to the history of the Basilica di San Marco, an architectural masterpiece of Byzantine influences, and the Campanile, the city's tallest structure. As you stroll through the square, your guide will share stories about the Doge's Palace, where the Venetian government once operated, and the mysterious Bridge of Sighs.

From there, you will wander through Venice's winding canals, crossing over charming bridges, and passing hidden courtyards. Your guide will take you to lesser-known neighbourhoods, revealing the true soul of the city. You will visit artisan shops, where glassblowers and mask makers still practice centuries-old crafts and learn about the rich history of Venetian trade and craftsmanship.

The tour will also include a stop at the Rialto Bridge, Venice's most famous bridge, where you will be able to take in the lively atmosphere of the Grand Canal. The day will end with an optional gondola ride, gliding through the narrow canals and beneath ancient bridges.

DAY 2

VALPOLICELLA REGION

DAY 3

WINE TOUR IN VENICE & LAGOON ISLANDS

Board your private boat and reach Sant'Erasmus Island. The ride will take about 30 minutes and offers stunning views of the lagoon. Sant'Erasmus is known as the Garden of Venice, famed for its agricultural products, especially artichokes and wine. Visit a local vineyard: here you'll receive a guided tour explaining the unique challenges and techniques of winemaking in a lagoon environment. Discover the cultivation methods used to grow grapes in saline soil, which contributes to the unique flavor profiles of the wines. Enjoy a tasting session featuring the island's signature wines, such as Orto di Venezia. This wine, produced from local grape varieties, offers a crisp and refreshing taste, perfect for the lagoon climate. Pair the wines with light bites of local cheeses and cured meats, showcasing the flavors of the Venetian region. After the tasting, take a short boat ride to Mazzorbo Island, connected to Burano by a picturesque wooden bridge. Enjoy another guided tour of a local winery. Learn about their award-winning Dorona di Venezia wine, a rare variety indigenous to the region. After lunch at leisure, take a short boat ride to the colorful island of Burano, famous for its lace-making and vibrant houses. Stroll through the picturesque streets, visiting lace shops and enjoying the scenic views.

DAY 4

PIEDMONT

Transfer from Venice to the picturesque Piedmont region, renowned for its stunning landscapes and world-class wines, including Barolo and Barbaresco.

DAY 6

Transfer from Piedmont to Florence by Mercedes vehicle.
